



DR. YUSUF MOHAMMED ABDULLAHI RE-APPOINTED CHIEF MEDICAL DIRECTOR



President Bola Ahmed Tinubu GCFR, has Re appointed Dr. Yusuf Mohammed Abdullahi as Chief Medical Director of the Federal Teaching Hospital Gombe, for a second tenure with effect from September 5, 2024.

The letter conveying his reappointment was presented by the Coordinating Minister of Health and Social Welfare, Prof. Muhammad Ali Pate, at a brief ceremony in Abuja. According to the letter, the CMD's re-appointment by President Bola Ahmed Tinubu was in "recognition of his outstanding leadership and contributions to the hospital's growth during his first tenure in office as the Chief Medical Director of the hospital".

Dr. Abdullahi was first appointed as the Chief Medical Director in September 2021 by President Muhammadu Buhari. His first tenure recorded tremendous transformation in and around the hospital. Some of which include; the introduction of Electronic Medical Records (EMR), which fully digitalized the clinical process, bringing about efficiency and cost saving. Additionally, he established the Schools of Nursing (Basic-ND/HND and Post Basic Programmes), Health Information Management and the first School of Dispensing Opticianry in the North East Region, for manpower training.

Equally, as CMD, he saw to the construction, renovation as well as expansion of clinics and service areas to boost clinical services. It is also a mark of his first tenure that there was sustained industrial harmony as staff welfare matters, such as staff training, payment of allowance and clearing of all outstanding allowances were given prominence.

Dr. Abdullahi's return therefore, signals a continuous commitment to build a legacy of excellence, modern healthcare techniques, and quality healthcare services at the Federal Teaching Hospital Gombe and beyond.

This was contained in a circular issued by the Director of Administration/Secretary of the Governing Board of the hospital, with effect from April 2, 2025, for a term of two years.

Born in Pindiga, Akko Local Government Area of Gombe State. She had her primary education in Kaduna, attended the Federal Government Girls' College, Bwari-Abuja and the prestigious University of Maiduguri for her MBBS.

Dr. Farouk is a Consultant in Obstetrics and Gynecology with the Federal Teaching Hospital Gombe, Associate Professor in Gynecology at Gombe State University and a Fellow of the West African College of Surgeons (FWACS).

Prior to this appointment, Dr. Farouk served as the Head of Department Obstetrics and Gynecology at the hospital.

SPOTLIGHT ON DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY MEDICINE

When Dr. Yusuf Mohammed Abdullahi assumed office as the Chief Medical Director of the Federal Teaching Hospital Gombe in 2021, his vision was to transform the hospital into a world class tertiary hospital in the country. In fulfilment, he set out to transform the General Out Patient Department (GOPD).

According to google, "GOPD stands for General Out Patient Department which serves as the primary entry point for patients seeking non specialized medical care and provides clinical and nursing services. The GOPD is the initial point of contact for patients who do not require immediate specialists' attention, offering a range of services including clinical examination, investigations, first line primary care and nursing procedures".

A Vision Realized

The transformation began in April 2022 with the conversion of General Out Patient Department to Department of Family Medicine and the appointment of Dr. Ishaq Muhammad Inuwa, a Consultant Family Physician as its pioneer Head of Department. On assuming office, Dr. Inuwa began restructuring the department in accordance with the CMD's mandate. Previously, the GOPD comprised the male and female outpatient, NHIA and the retainership clinics. With the restructuring for improved service delivery, these clinics were transformed to General Out Patient Unit, Retainership Unit and National Health Insurance Authority (NHIA) Unit. The Accident & Emergency was also brought under the control of the Department of Family Medicine as a unit, in addition to the Federal Secretariat Clinic being managed by the hospital.

A More Efficient and Integrated System

In the past, patients visiting the GOPD had to navigate various parts of the hospital for different services, which was quite cumbersome. The CMD and HOD took note of this challenge and set out to evolve a couple of initiatives to make the entire process more efficient. One of such initiatives was the design, construction and citing of the NHIA Complex opposite the Administrative building.

With this development, the NHIA clinic has been relocated to the new complex. This move has resulted in enhanced service delivery with the integration of these services; pharmaceutical, laboratory, health information, billing and payment under one

roof. Additionally, due to the unrestricted patient flow, there is a proposal to extend the clinic hours from 12 to 24 hours, delivering a whole new experience for NHIA Patients as confirmed by the HOD.

"Now, everything is within the same complex. It's a game-changer for both patients and staff. The proximity of essential services has made a noticeable impact on the speed of patient's care, allowing for quicker diagnosis with immediate access to medications and lab results".

Addressing Challenges

The move has also addressed long-standing challenges, particularly those related to the National Health Insurance (NHIA) patients. Under the old system, NHIA patients faced delays due to the separation of services. The new complex brings these services together, ensuring quicker, more comprehensive care. Furthermore, Dr. Muhammad revealed that once the second phase of the building is completed, the department will offer 24-hour services, further improving patient access. Diagnostic capabilities have also been enhanced. Laboratory results are now expected within one to two hours, and the consistent availability of medications ensures that patients can receive the treatments they need without unnecessary delays.

Opportunities for Training and Research

The new complex also presents exciting opportunities for staff development. With more space and resources, the Family Medicine Department is better equipped to train resident doctors and support research, especially in the context of common conditions seen in family medicine. Dr. Muhammad expressed enthusiasm about fostering a research culture, with the resident doctors already being encouraged to pursue research and data collection.

A Message of Gratitude

Dr. Muhammad expressed heartfelt gratitude to the management for the unwavering support in bringing the new complex to fruition.

As the Family Medicine Department continues to grow and evolve, the new NHIA complex stands as a testament to the hospital's commitment to providing quality care to its patients.



INSTITUTE OF HEALTH SCIENCES & TECHNOLOGY RELOCATES TO PERMANENT SITE

Following the completion of work at its permanent site, the Institute of Health Sciences & Technology, Federal Teaching Hospital Gombe, which was hitherto accommodated at the isolation complex has moved to its permanent site.

The institute which was established in 2023 under the dynamic leadership of the Chief Medical Director, Prof. Yusuf Mohammed Abdullahi has the College of Nursing Sciences, Post Basic and Basic Nursing Programmes; School of Health Information Management and School of Dispensing Opticianry.

So far, two sets of the Post Basic Nursing Programme in Critical Care and Perioperative Nursing, as well as, the first set of the National Diploma Programme in Dispensing Opticianry have been graduated.

The permanent site has the administrative building, school building, students' hostels, as well as provision for recreational area, designed to enhance the learning experience of the students.

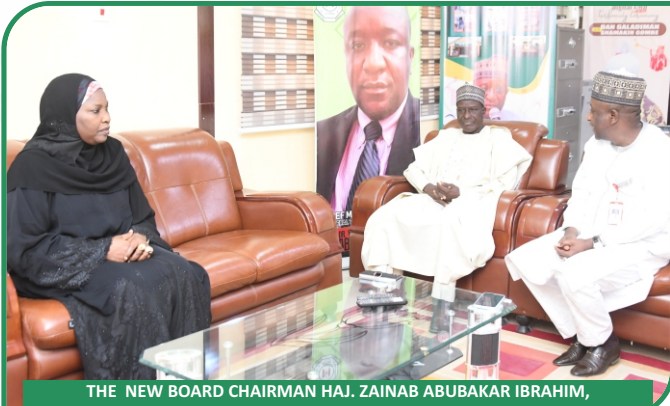

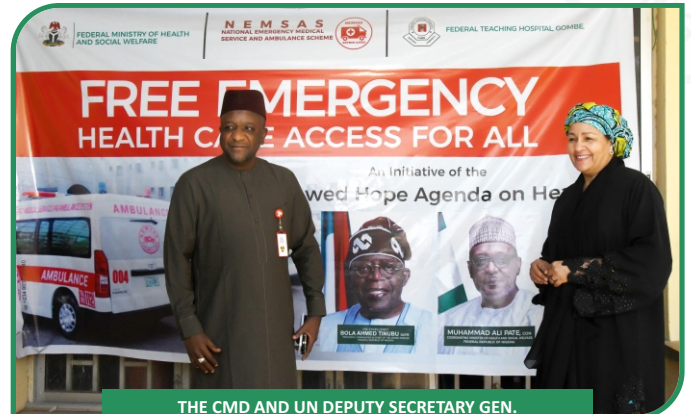

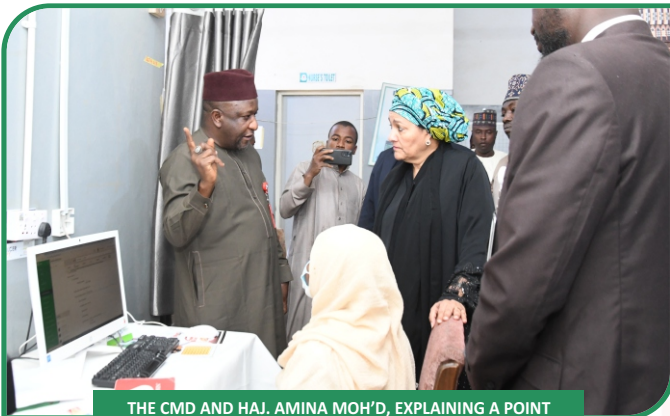
